



What is Cyberbullying?

Sending insults or threats via text messaging or social media. Spreading rumors for the purpose of damaging a person's reputation.

Pretending to be someone you are <u>not</u> online. Posting a picture of your new puppy.

What is Cyberbullying?


Posting an unflattering or embarrassing picture or video of another person. Discussing a movie you just saw.

Sharing about your day.

Spreading sexually suggestive pictures or messages about another person.

Cyberbullying

1 out of 3 teens have been cyberbullied.



What's the big deal?

+Cyberbullying has the ability to reach a wide audience with the single click of a mouse or the send button on a mobile phone.

+It is very difficult to defend oneself from cyberbullying as the perpetrator is often anonymous.

+Victims of cyberbullying experience higher levels of anxiety and school absences, and lower levels of self-esteem.

Consequences of Cyberbullying

Not a Rite of Passage

In most states, bullying <u>and</u> cyberbullying are against school policy and state law.

At school:

 Not allowed to participate in certain school activities

Suspension

Legally you may face charges:

 You could be criminally charged with harassment or stalking



Long-term implications:

It could limit your ability to receive certain scholarships or secure certain jobs

What to do if it happens to you...

Know that it is NOT your fault!

Don't respond.

Save evidence.

Block the perpetrator.

Ask for help.

Use tools within the app/website.

Protect your accounts.

If someone you know is being bullied, take action!

If you wouldn't want your grandmother to see it, don't post it online. Post abou


Pause and think before you share.
